Your classes



GMAT preparation

Your test preparation classes will focus in detail on each aspect of the test using Kaplan's exclusive course materials to help you achieve the best results possible.



Structured Study

Your Structured Study sessions are an integral part of your course during which you will have access to our extensive library of study materials. Teaching component

Program Structure

GMAT

During week 1, you receive:

- ▲ 16 sessions (minimum) of Structured Study

Each week during weeks 2 – 6, you receive:

- 8 lessons of GMAT Preparation
- ▲ 20 sessions (minimum) of Structured Study

Each week during weeks 7 – 12, you receive:

- ▲ 30 sessions (minimum) of Structured Study
- 1 hour teaching component

Classes can be scheduled in the morning, afternoon or evening, depending on your chosen location.
